1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

4.1 The committee agreed the following at its October meeting:

- Adult Social Care Day & Work Opportunities (Phase 1 & 2) – a 6 month update report to be submitted to the committee in order to provide assurance to members on the opportunities being provided for service users – this has now been scheduled for May 2019;
- A further meeting with the Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board in 12 months to focus on updating the committee on progress with the Mental Health Strategy and Child & Adolescent Mental Health Services.

4.2 At the October meeting, during its consideration of the Review of Day & Work Opportunities in Adult Social Care, the committee requested that it receive a report on Phase 3 of the Review prior to formal consultation on options. The Department has now advised that they will be undertaking co-production with service users and stakeholders in the coming weeks and propose returning to scrutiny in February / March 2019 (tbc) with the proposed options, prior to commencing consultation. Officers have also advised that elected members will have the opportunity to be involved in the co-production stage via an All Member workshop to be held on 19th December at 4pm.
