

Appendix 2 Proposed Phase 1 Clusters or Hubs

Selection criteria

- Scale of catchment population with access to secondary school (1k+ local population)
- Area with greater facility needs
- Potential to grow and get better – availability commitment and ability of key personnel
- Robust existing organisations – successful/effective/number of volunteers members and teams
- Locations where existing Council run facilities can be best transferred to new operating models with the desired benefits ensuing

Essential

- Junior clubs which are significant in size and meet the requirements of the FAW Club Accreditation programme (5-10+ teams)
- Clubs/activities with potential to grow the women's and girls' game
- Workforce – personnel with desire/experience

○ **Desirable**

- Senior clubs that require better facilities for domestic pyramid regulations -Domestic Pyramid Levels 2-4 or aspiring with potential for promotion
- Women or girls teams
- Clubs that offer a complete player pathway from mini to senior football

○ **Willing**

- Preparedness to:

- Work together
- Be open and inclusive
- Work towards combined senior junior club models – complete and seamless pathway, minis- youth 16s- adult and subscribe to FAW and Trust good practice guidance and accreditation standards
- Commit to embrace and develop girls football and ultimately a senior ladies team
- Be open to support disability football if a need is identified
- Be inclusive – i.e. positive attitude re equality
